We greatly enjoyed your presence and hope you all got a good chance to see what ham radio is like. We will post our total point count later once it's all tabulated. Thanks for coming, and we now look forward to Winter Field Day in January!

I am happy to say that our ARRL Field Day 2025 log has been officially submitted! We claimed a total of 1,944 points. Here's the breakdown:

Operators (6):

- Paul WB7N = 89 QSOs (48%)
- Billy K7FRW = 74 QSOs (40%)
- Mike KK7MRQ = 15 QSOs (8%)
- Nick K7RM = 4 QSOs (2%)
- Dave AD7GU = 3 QSOs (2%)
- Randy KJ7COB - 1 QSO (1%)

Bonus Points Claimed (1,350):

- 100% emergency power: 600 points
- Media publicity: 100 points
- Public location: 100 points
- Public information table: 100 points
- Formal message to ARRL SM/SEC: 100 points
- Formal messages handled (10 x 10, max of 100): 100 points
- Safety officer: 100 points
- Social media: 100 points
- Entry submitted via web: 50 points

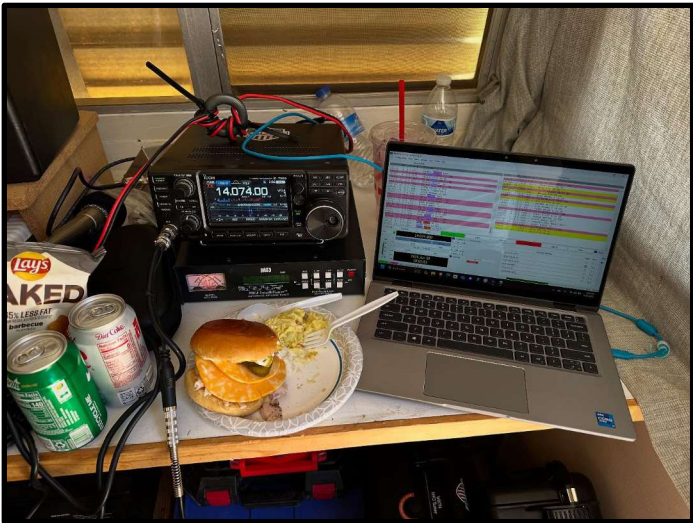

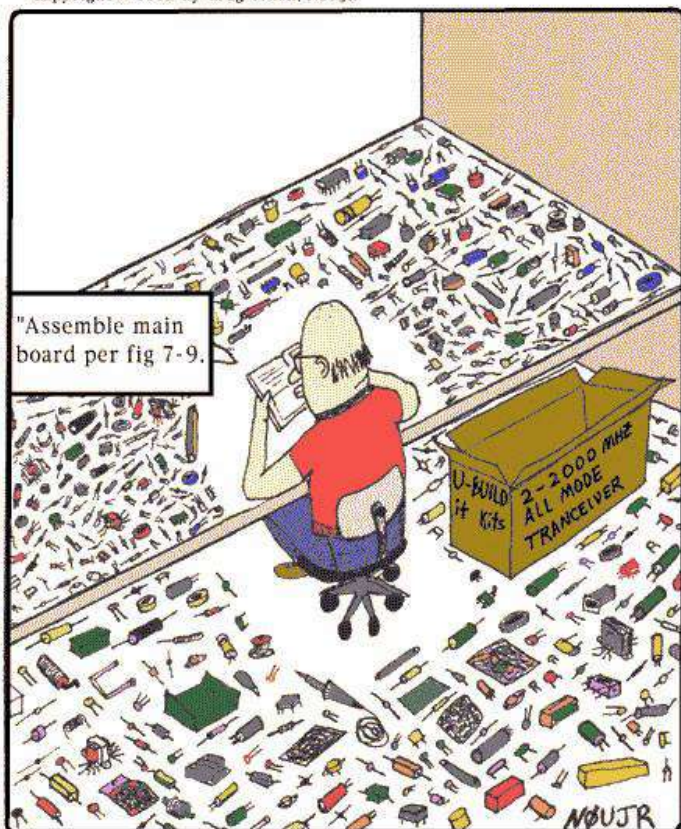
